SPEAKING AND WRITING SKILLS 5 (B1.2)

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Understand and express yourself in general situations that require exchanging information and showing personal attitudes on multiple familiar topics, but not only those related to your personal experience.

CONTENTS

- Talking about the past I: Telling actions with or without relation to the present. Refer to a specific moment. Refer to an amount of time. Relate two moments from the past.
- Talk about the past II: Talk about habits and their frequency in the present in relation to the past. Describe in the past tense. Count time and indicate limits.
- Talk about the past III: Tell anecdotes and stories. Introduce a perspective into the story
- Talk about the future: Express degrees of security regarding the future. Relate actions in the future.
- Express average probability conditions.
- Describe and request information about itineraries
- React to news. Express security.
- Express opinions and react to them. Show agreement and disagreement. Express an attitude towards shared information
- Refer words I: Repeat what was said. Ask indirectly. Mark changes in spatial and personal reference. Transmit what was said.
- Refer words II: Mark changes in temporal reference. Mark the validity of the words referred to or their belonging to the past.
- Request information in public services (formal). Indicate advantages and disadvantages.
- Ask and give advice.
- Describe and identify something of which we have no experience.
- Make hypotheses. Refer a hypothesis to the present/future and the immediate past. React to a hypothesis. Express surprise.
- Congratulate, thank and react to congratulations and thanks. Invite, accept and reject invitations. Express wishes in specific situations. Praise and react to praise.
- Request objects and actions and react to requests. Mark the degree of formality of the request. Offer objects or actions and react to the offer.

METHODOLOGY

Given the immersive nature of teaching in the CLM, during class instruction the student develops the strategies, linguistic and socio-cultural knowledge that allow them to face these transactions, social interactions and texts outside the classroom, always connecting said personal experience with class instruction.

EVALUATION
