




The Royal Chapel in Granada is a Gothic building constructed by the Catholic Monarchs as the resting place for their bodies. The Catholic Monarchs, their daughter Joan the Mad, and son Philip the Handsome are all buried there.

Granada Cathedral is one of the most outstanding works of Spanish Renaissance architecture. It was built between 1518 and 1561 in the centre of the former Muslim medina and on top of the ruins of the Mezquita Mayor. The main façade stands out for its three arches and enormous 57 metre-high tower. On the inside, its impressive dimensions and the huge columns adorned in Corinthian style are especially remarkable.





Córdoba is a city with an enormous cultural and monumental legacy. Its strategic location, close to the formerly navigable Guadalquivir river, and the heritage of the different peoples who settled in its rich lands, have turned it into a privileged place. Walking through the old town of Córdoba is to discover a beautiful network of streets, squares and whitewashed courtyards arranged around the Mezquita-Cathedral, reflecting the importance of the city during medieval times and a true symbol of the capital.



This town in the province of Málaga is divided in two by the Tajo de Ronda, a gorge over 150 meters deep. The old part of the town was declared a Site of Cultural Interest. Celts, Phoenicians, Romans and Arabs inhabited these lands, which were reconquered by the Catholic Monarchs. The old town, reminiscent of the Moorish style and with medieval traces, spreads out south of the Guadalevín river, while modern Ronda, which started to emerge in the 16th century, unfolds to the north. Several bridges join these two halves of what is one of the most interesting towns on the route of the Pueblos Blancos.

Andalucía Emprende is a foundation set up by the Andalusian regional government, the Junta de Andalucía, whose mission is to promote the development of entrepreneurial culture and economic activity in Andalucía, with the ultimate aim of contributing to the generation of competitive businesses and quality jobs in the region. Our visit involves analyzing the process of starting up businesses, contacting entrepreneurs who will explain their own experience of opening a business, and also visit some companies in different economic sectors.



In 1930 Aceites Maeva was founded, a family business from one generation to the next, dedicated to the production of extra virgin olive oil. In recent years this company has grown into an expanding business with international prospects.

Aceites Maeva has been the market leader in packaging extra virgin olive oil since 2002 thanks to the integration of all the production processes, from cultivation to packaging and marketing, and our privileged location, in the heart of the main olive oil producing area, Andalucía.

The visit covers all their installations: from the almazara (olive oil mill) to the packaged product. The talk will be given by the company's head chemist.

Each participant will receive a free oil sample.



Rubbish dumps for all types of waste receiving more than 10 tonnes per day or with a total capacity of over 25,000 tonnes, excluding landfills of inert waste.


We begin our visit with a workshop in which we learn about the recycling process. Then we will learn to recycle making objects out of rubbish. Finally, we will be shown how the entire process works from when the rubbish arrives to when it becomes compost.

Guided tour of two buildings representative of the Renaissance and Baroque periods in Granada: the 16th century Hospital Real, home to the Rector's office at the University of Granada, and the Monasterio de San Jeronimo, with its Renaissance cloisters and magnificent altarpiece in its church.

# VISIT TO THE FRANCISCO AYALA FOUNDATION > VISITS ORGANIZED ON REQUEST Approximate Approx

Guided visit to an ancient Moorish palace in the Jardin de la Reina neighbourhood, which houses the Francisco Ayala Foundation headquarters. The tour includes a 15-minute walk, a visit to the garden and the palace tower, the screening of a documentary on the life of the author from Granada and a complimentary book.



Stroll through the city centre to sample Granada's most typical tapas. Each drink ordered comes with a free snack known as a 'tapa'.



The Centro de Lenguas Modernas offers the possibility of organizing gastronomic, musical and cultural soirees at a traditional teahouse in the Albayzín quarter to sample green tea with mint served in the traditional berrada or Arabic tea pot, accompanied by an assortment of pastries made with almond paste, dates and honey. This activity also includes an oriental dance show where the dancer alternates slow arm to head movements expressing sadness with other faster ones performed with the hip and belly to express joy, creating an unforgettable and magical atmosphere.





CLM offers an educational workshop on flamenco dancing, in which students can become familiar with some of the most important aspects of this genuine art. The dancer María José Albaicin and her accompanying musicians, following an explanation of the origin and meaning of flamenco, perform a large sample of different flamenco styles. Once the show is over, students can ask questions related to the topic and even learn a few basic steps lead by the hand of the dancer.



Included in the program of the International Tango Festival held in Granada in the months of February-March, the Centro de Lenguas Modernas hosts an interesting proposal. This is an illustrated lecture on tango given by Horacio Révora, director of the Festival. Thanks to him, the students are guided through the history, origin and evolution of tango, given the opportunity to see interesting live displays of dance, music and songs performed by some of the best known figures on the national and international tango scene.



These workshops will make students familiar with the history and development of the guitar in flamenco, offering a live display of some of the most important flamenco styles. The guitar is usually accompanied by the violin, voice and other accompanying instruments. At the end of the show, students can ask any question related to this instrument and music.



As part of the activities organized by the International Relations Office to welcome the Erasmus students each semester, and as a welcome and farewell event for CLM students on the Spanish Language and Culture and Hispanic Studies Courses, the Magician Pequi gives a performance with sets of handkerchiefs, cards, ropes, appearing and disappearing acts, escapology, mentalism ...Magic at its best!

# CLM THEATRE WORKSHOP > CULTURAL EVENTS AT CLM Tallerde Teatro Centrode Lenguas Modernas

CLM runs a free theatre workshop for both foreign and Spanish students. It is designed to integrate students from different countries, improve their linguistic skills and develop their spoken and physical communication techniques through acting games, body language, and improvisation. At the end of each semester, students put on a play to practice the skills learnt. The play is chosen to fit the nature of the workshop and is adapted from texts by either classical or contemporary Spanish authors. The workshop takes place on Thursday from 18.00 to 21.00 once a week and lasts from October to December and from January to May.

# FILM CYCLES > CULTURAL EVENTS AT CLM REPRINTED BY CONTROL OF THE PRINT OF THE PRI

Thanks to the extraordinary resources of the CLM Library, many language departments organize film cycles throughout the academic year. The aim is that all those CLM students who wish to, can watch films in their original language and thus gain a closer understanding of the culture and language they are studying. The film screenings are often accompanied by debates and discussions lead by specialist teachers before and afterwards.



The Centro de Lenguas Modernas offers students the possibility of attending culinary workshops (oil tasting, Christmas confectionery tasting, wine tasting, workshop on seasoning olives, etc..) on a regular basis. The purpose of these is to give students a closer understanding of a fundamental part of Spanish culture and go into depth about its origin, history and contemporary significance of some of the most important products in our cuisine. Attendees also have the opportunity to carry out tasting guided by specialists.



Lead by the Zarambeques group, graduates and faculty from the Victoria Eugenia Advanced College of Music in Granada, the Centro de Lenguas Modernas organizes early music concerts to bring their students closer to some important chapter in Spanish history through music. Depending on the historical moment, concerts of medieval, Renaissance and Baroque music are given.



The Centro de Lenguas Modernas organizes puppet shows for English learners. Through collaboration with the Carvalho Caravana Company, it offers performances in different formats: twelve stories on various subjects; 30-, 45- or 60- minute performances; elementary, intermediate or advanced levels - all in English/Spanish and with the common goal of offering a fun and different way to advance our English learning.



Over the different academic years, the Centro de Lenguas Modernas receives a variety of different proposals to offer its students. Many of them, and thanks to the collaboration of the Vice-Rector's Office for Culture, Arts and Sports, are part of lecture cycles, poetry recitals, concerts. An attempt to bring students closer to the city of Granada's most current agenda and panorama.



As part of the activities for foreign language students, the Centro de Lenguas Modernas offers storytelling in French adapted to the required level. It also seeks to organize similar shows for students of German, Italian, etc.



### **Route**

We leave CLM and head towards the Paseo del Salon down Cuesta Escoriaza. Then on to Puente Verde which links up with the Alminares neighbourhood and onto the "granadino" neighbourhood of the Zaidín to the Palacio de Deportes. From there, we go to the Campus de la Salud where we take the bike path to the Neptune shopping mall and then back to the Paseo del Salon and our original meeting place.

### **ASCENT TO ALJIBE DE LA LLUVIA**



Mountain bike tour that passes through the Parque de Invierno situated above the Alhambra.

■ DISTANCE: 10 km (approx.)
■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 300 m
■ DIFFICULTY: Medium

### **Route**

We leave CLM heading towards the Barranco del Abogado and onto the Alhambra car park, where we will take the path to the Parque de Invierno. After about 2 km, we arrive at the Aljibe de la Lluvia, preserved in very good condition, although at present only the high vault and an exterior wall next to a reservoir built latterly can be contemplated. At this point we start our descent down the winding track which takes us to the path to Silla del Moro. From here we get back on the tarmac and descend past the Alhambra and back to CLM.

### PINOS GENIL (along the Genil riverbank) MOUNTAIN BIKE Approximate A

Excursion through the River Genil Valley to the village of Pinos Genil, at the foot of Sierra Nevada.

■ DISTANCE: 12 km (approx.)
■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 20 m
■ DIFFICULTY: Very easy

### **Route**

We leave the meeting point down Cuesta Escoriaza and join the path to Fuente de la Bicha from the road to the Sierra. Once we are at the fountain, we cross the river and follow the lane on the left bank until we reach the village of Pinos Genil. Here we cross the river once more, and return on the path on the opposite bank back to Granada.

### **ASCENT TO LLANO DE LA PERDIZ**



Mountain bike tour that passes through the Parque de Invierno.

■ DISTANCE: 14 km (approx.)
■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 400 m
■ DIFFICULTY: Medium

### **Route**

We leave the meeting point along Calle Molinos, and join the road to the Barranco del Abogado up to the Alhambra junction. Then we take the track that leads to the Llano de the Perdíz. We return along the Camino de los Franceses until we get to the Alhambra again and back to CLM on the tarmac.

### **ASCENT TO LOS REBITES**



Excursion through the village of Huetor Vega and the Valle del Genil.

■ DISTANCE: 13 km (approx.)
■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 370 m
■ DIFFICULTY: Medium

### **Route**

We head to the "Bola de Oro" neighbourhood, where the slope to the Rebites starts. Then take the Camino de los Neveros up to a turning on the left just where the ascent to the Purche starts. At this point we begin our descent which will takes us along a path to the Fuente de la Bicha. At this point, we return along the Ribera del Genil to our starting place.

### ASCENT TO THE CANALES RESERVOIR



Through the Genil Valley, passing Cenes de la Vega, and Pinos Genil and finally the climb up to the Canales Dam.

■ DISTANCE: 28 km (approx.)
■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 600 m
■ DIFFICULTY: Medium

### **Route**

We head to the River Genil Valley along Paseo de las Palmas. After passing through Cenes de la Vega and Pinos Genil, we take the old road to Güejar Sierra which takes us directly to the canyon where the Canales dam looms above. Once we are there, we cross the bottom of the dam and climb up a track with a steep gradient to reach the top of the dam and enjoy the beautiful scenery. After taking a refreshment break, we start our return journey taking the same way back to Pinos Genil, where we follow the other riverbank back to Granada.

### CAMINO DE LOS FRANCESES – CENES – GRANADA



A tour through the Parque de Invierno de Granada and Cenes de la Vega. Great views of the Genil Valley and Sierra Nevada from the trails, paths and tracks.

■ DISTANCE: 15 km (approx.)
■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 400 m
■ DIFFICULTY: Medium

### Route

We leave CLM heading to the Barranco del Abogado and onto the Alhambra, where we enter the Parque de Invierno. After 1.5 km we turn right along the Camino de los Franceses and climb up to the end of the Parque de Invierno. At this point we are at an altitude of 1040 m. We go down to the crossroads that indicates Cenes, Jesus del Valle and the road to Dúdar. We take a right towards Cenes de la Vega and on the first curve to the left, we take the path which leads to Lancha de Cenes and back to Granada.

### LLANO DE LA PERDIZ – DÚDAR – GRANADA



Through the Parque de Invierno de Granada, Dúdar, Pinos Genil and Cenes de la Vega. Great panoramic views of the Genil Valley, Sierra Nevada and Sierra de Huétor from the trails, paths and tracks.

■ DISTANCE: 27 km (approx.)
■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 540 m
■ DIFFICULTY: Medium-high

### Route

We take the Barranco del Abogado up to the Alhambra and continue to the Parque de Invierno which is about 7 kms from the start. At this point we are at an altitude of 1040m. and we continue climbing to reach 1180m. We begin the descent to Dúdar passing the Canal de los Franceses aqueduct ruins. Once in Dúdar, we take the road that leads to Pinos Genil, where we join a path which takes us back to Granada along the banks of the Rio Genil.



A walk in the surrounding area of the Parque de Invierno and the Llano de la Perdiz (1,022 m high). Along the route, we will have panoramic views of the entire city of Granada, the Vega, Sierra Nevada, Sacromonte and the Albaicin.

**DURATION ON FOOT:** 3.5 hours (approx.)

**DISTANCE:** 15 km (approx.) **► HEIGHT DIFFERENCE:** 400 m

DIFFICULTY: Medium

### **Route**

We start out from CLM and within minutes we will enter the Bosque de la Alhambra and the Cerro del Generalife. After enjoying the beautiful views, we arrive at the Llano de la Perdíz where we will begin our descent to the Silla del Moro and Cuesta de los Chinos and finish in Plaza Nueva.

This itinerary will take us through the western part of Sierra Nevada and allow us to see a beautiful view of the foothills and the 3000m. crest stretching from the Pico Veleta to the Caballo peak.

**DISTANCE:** 10 km (approx.) **► HEIGHT DIFFERENCE:** 500 m

**DIFFICULTY:** Medium

### **Route**

The main line bus takes us to Cumbres Verdes. We set out for el Fuente del Hervidero and continue to the Boca del Pescado until we reach an area where many other walks begin (Mirador de los Alayos). From the summit we descend the southern slope, taking a path to the power plant at Dilar. Once on the track we follow the river bank until we reach Dílar where we catch the bus back to Granada.

### **ASCENT TO LOS CAHORROS**



Excursion to one of the most impressive and beautiful landscapes in the Sierra Nevada foothills.

**DURATION ON FOOT:** 4.5 hours (approx.)

■ DISTANCE: 11 km (approx.)■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 400 m■ DIFFICULTY: Medium-high

### **Route**

We will take the main line bus to Monachil and from there, start our walk on foot to the Garganta de Los Cahorros (rather well known nationally by rock climbing lovers). We will continue upstream the Monachil river crossing several suspension bridges and narrow passes. We walk up to the power plant at Diéchar to take a path that will lead us back to Monachil, enjoying beautiful views of the Vega de Granada.

### TREKKING - ARAB BATHS



A walk in the surrounding area of the Parque de Invierno and the Llano de la Perdiz (1,022 m high). Along the route we will have panoramic views of the entire city of Granada, the Vega, Sierra Nevada, Sacromonte and the Albaicin. Afterwards we can enjoy a relaxing session at the Arab Baths in their hot and cold water rooms, and a massage that will leave us as new!

**DURATION ON FOOT:** 3.5 hours (approx.)

**DISTANCE:** 15 km (approx.) **► HEIGHT DIFFERENCE:** 400 m

**▶ DIFFICULTY:** Medium

### **Route**

We start out from CLM and within minutes we will enter the Bosque de la Alhambra and the Cerro del Generalife. Once in Plaza Nueva we will head to the Arab Baths.

Ascent known as the "King of the Low Mountain": the Pico del Trevenque (2000 meters). A classic in the history of any hiker. This time we will climb the traditional route known as the crest of the Trevenque.

**DURATION ON FOOT:** 6 hours (approx.)

■ DISTANCE: 13 km (approx.)
■ HEIGHT DIFFERENCE: 600 m
■ DIFFICULTY: Medium-high

### **Route**

The main line bus will take us to Cumbres Verdes. We set out for the Fuente del Hervidero. We continue to the Canal de la Espartera and at the beginning of Cuesta del Fresno, we take the track up the hill and follow the crest until we reach the base of the peak and then on up to the top. We return along the northern Trevenque, descending to a track that will take us to the Casa Forestal de la Cortijuela, Fuente del Hervidero and Cumbres Verdes.

### VISIT TO THE SIERRA NEVADA SKI RESORT AND "EL DORNAJO" VISITORS' CENTRE



A visit to the most southern ski resort in Europe. We will stroll around the Pradollano area and see the different parts of the resort.

At "El Dornajo" visitors centre, participants will receive detailed information on flora, fauna, mountain morphology, topography, resources, architecture, shelters, crafts, customs, etc ... through panels, models, photographs and videos.

**DURATION:** 4 hours (approx.)

NOTE: High protection suntan lotion is recommended.

**■ DIFFICULTY:** Very easy

### FUENTE DEL HERVIDERO -PICO DE LA CARNE-MONACHIL

> HIKING



An excursion that covers one of the most beautiful landscapes of Sierra Nevada and gives us a spectacular view of Granada.

**DURATION ON FOOT:** 5 hours (approx.)

**DISTANCE:** 13 km (approx.) **► HEIGHT DIFFERENCE:** 600 m

**▶ DIFFICULTY:** Medium

### Route

Departure in a main line bus that takes us to Cumbres Verdes. We will set out for the Fuente del Hervidero. We continue the forest trail until we encounter the Puente de los Siete Ojos. Once we get to the bridge, we will take a path that goes off to the left. This path leads to Fuente Fría passing over the Pico de la Carne summit. Once at Fuente Fría, we will descend to the refuge of the same name. We then take the path that goes behind the refuge and down the shady side of the hill until we arrive at Monachil.



Treks on horseback in the surrounding areas of the village of Dílar (a farming area) and different parts of the Sierra Nevada Nature Reserve, taking in the wide variety of flora and fauna. These attempt to encourage friendship within student groups in a fun setting, provide an opportunity to come into contact with nature, and to approach horse riding not just as a sport but also as a means of opening up and learning about the environment.

Students will be accompanied at all times by qualified instructors, who are able to transmit the basic or advanced principals (depending on the participants' level) of riding, as well as providing information on the natural surroundings both in Spanish and English, making it a fun learning experience.

**DURATION:** 1 to 1.5 hours.

**DIFFICULTY:** Easy



### **Description**

A trip to Granada's Costa Tropical where we will spend a day in contact with the sea. Enjoy a pleasant sail around the bay of La Herradura for about 1 hour and then some kayaking. If we have enough energy after these activities, we can play a game of beach volleyball. At around 13.30h, it will be time to have a bite to eat and sunbathe. Food is not included. We will leave at 16.00h and arrive back in Granada at 17.30h.
